Sunday Gatherings

The Solon Community Center (SCC) is closed indefinitely until further notice. This means that our church family will not have any church gatherings on Sunday mornings for the foreseeable future. However, one of our core beliefs is that WE are the church, not a service or a building. With this in mind, our elders have been video conferencing to determine ways we can continue to express our identities of family, servant, and missionary in light of the new realities of social distancing.

Connectedness

The reality is that we are created to be in relationship. Relationship with God and relationship with each other. In light of this, we want to make sure we continue to have a sense of community and connectedness during this time. As the days and weeks of social distancing continue, we want to make sure each of you feels like you are not alone in our common feelings of fear, anxiety, uncertainty, financial stress, and isolation.

Plan

We have a three-pronged approach to combat these feelings and instead make this time as productive and resilient as possible. We are hopeful this time can be an opportunity for us to grow in our discipleship as followers of Jesus who trust Him in the midst of uncertainty.

We will have individual communication check-ins (phone, Facetime or Zoom) with each of you. You will be hearing from someone soon. (If you don't hear from someone from JCC soon, please reach out immediately. We don't want anyone to not be connected.)

You will receive a weekly email (1st one will come on Sunday AM). This email will have a relevant video message for you to watch with some discussion questions included for further reflection. Our JCKids director and FUSE director are working on ideas for further discipleship with our young people while they are at home. These suggestions will be emailed out as well.

May we continue to trust in our God. He is our fortress. Please find comfort through God's word to us.
